

MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING

BETWEEN

MINISTERIAL CONFERENCE ON FISHERIES COOPERATION AMONG AFRICAN STATES BORDERING THE ATLANTIC OCEAN (ATLAFCO)

AND

LONG DISTANCE REGIONAL ADVISORY COUNCIL (LDRAC)

Whereas the Ministerial Conference on Fisheries Cooperation among African States Bordering the Atlantic Ocean (ATLAFCO) is an inter-governmental organization created in 1989 and composed of 22 States; from Morocco to Namibia, and the Convention establishing ATLAFCO, "The Atlantic Regional Convention for Fisheries Cooperation," was adopted in 1991, with the main objectives to promote and strengthen the regional cooperation on fisheries development; and to coordinate and to harmonize efforts and capacities of stakeholders for the conservation and sustainable use of fisheries resources;

Whereas the "Long Distance Regional Advisory Council" (LDRAC) has been created in 2004 on the basis of the EU Council Decision 585/2004, and it has become operational in 2007 following the adoption of the EU Commission Decision 2007/206/EC, with the aim to advise the European Commission on issues regarding the management and conservation of fisheries resources to contribute to the implementation of the principles of the Common Fisheries Policy outside Community waters and to improving the external relations of the EU in fisheries matters:

Exploring common areas of interest for LDAC and COMHAFAT (i)

- Foster cooperation and preparation of RFMOs of shared interest (ICCAT)
- Promote upgrading / enhanced role of CECAF as decision-making body
- Improve implementation of sectoral support in SFPAs: promoting consultation among stakeholders on priority setting, transparency and accountability in its use.
- Fight against IUU Fishing: Interactive training sessions use of EU SMEFF database.
- Role of artisanal fisheries from non-EU coastal states: cohabitation.
- **Visibility of women in fisheries:** access to fish, commercialization, health and safety, training, child caring.





Exploring common areas of interest for LDAC and COMHAFAT (ii)

- Capacity building:

Regional cooperation on scientific and MCS in ATLAFCO area, including

- Implementation of regional programmes for scientific observers
- Harmonized control schemes for EU vessels at African ports;
- Shared methodology for data collection / reporting to Flag & Coastal States;
- Social dimension & labour conditions in fisheries:
 - Ratification and implementation of legal instruments of maritime safety
 - Improving working conditions at sea and protection of observers
 - Training of crews and observers (ILO C188, IMO STCW-F...)
- International ocean governance processes (UN, FAO, CBD, ISA...)
- Impact of Climate Change for African artisanal fisheries
- **Food security** (overfishing /IUU, production of fishmeal for animal feed)
- Blue Economy and Fishing: impact of other extractive activities
